Feasibility Study

At the launch in November 2006 Ed Ball MP for Normanton wearing his 'constituency hat' gave a very upbeat speech praising the work done and supporting the whole idea, various representatives from BW, other canal organisations and regional bodies gave a very positive response from the audience so its on to the next stage.

The Barnsley Canals Consortium (a grouping of Local Authorities and other interested bodies including the Trust) has been working over the last few months since we published the Feasibility Study negotiating with various landowners in order to secure the route suggested by Atkins Plc in their report. There is an increasing sense of urgency because Local Authority Unitary Development Plans are currently being reviewed, and evidence from the feasibility study is required to protect the route under a planning review. The suggested route into and through Swinton may need drastically revising due to redevelopment in the area; negotiations with Rotherham MBC are ongoing.

Willow Bank Partnership

The Willow Bank Partnership has joined the Consortium. Their representative, Colin Heseltine, outlined their interest in reinstating the Barnsley Canal from 'Smithies' upstream towards Barugh, a distance of about 2 miles and includes a section of old opencast mine workings which are due for re-landscaping by UK Coal Plc. Initially Willow Bank Partnership would like to identify and set out footpaths along the line of the canal which would connect with other routes in the area such as the Dearne Way and Transpennine Trails.

Willow Bank Partnership brings an added benefit in that one of their members has expertise in the ecological field – a very useful talent.

The Trust would appreciate help from UK Coal in reinstating the Canal across their piece of land.

This point, at the bottom of Low Barugh Locks will probably be the accepted terminus of the canal – a suitable location for a 50 + boat Marina??

Walking Routes

The Consortium has agreed to investigate the production of leaflets identifying walking routes which may incorporate the route of the canal – to this end – if you have a favourite walk around the Barnsley, Dearne & Dove Canals area please let us have details! – send to June Backhouse, Barnsley Dearne Dove Canals Trust, 39 Hill Street, Elsecar, Barnsley, S74.8EN, Or via email at our website www.bddct.org.uk
